# NON-EXAMPLES

Tone and mood are not the same

Tone- the piece of literature a narrator's attitude is towards the subject, rather than what the reader feels

mood-A general feeling or atmosphere that a piece of writing creates within the reader. mood is produced most effectively through the use of setting, theme, voice and tone.
