Definition Of Idiom

An Idiom is an expression, word, or phrase that has a figurative meaning or the associative meaning. Example: A drop in the Ocean Meaning: A very small part of something.

An Idiom is a figure of speech that does not have the obvious presented meaning. Idioms differ from culture and country, as the phrase uses commonplace objects, people, or animals. Example: Raining Cats and Dogs Meaning: It's raining hard.

Purpose

Idioms are group of words with a special meaning that is quite different from the meaning of the individual words. Many writers use idioms to make their writing more interesting and it helps readers understand the topic in a humorous way.

Examples of Idiom

The ten most common examples of idioms are...

- Piece of cake
- rub someone the wrong way
- once in a blue moon
- break a leg
- when pigs fly
- you can not judge a book by its cover
- bite off more than you can chew
- taste of your own medicine
- add fuel to the fire
- actions speak louder than words



Idioms are not...

Idioms can sometimes get confused with metaphors. A metaphor is a comparison between two or more things. While idioms are phrases that do not make sense by its literal definition, but have a completely different and metaphorical meaning.

Metaphors: Love is war, he is the sun of my sky

Idioms: piece of cake, break a leg
